

Sunday Evening Monthly House Groups 2020

We commence next Sunday evening at the hall. There will be sign up sheets for various house groups that will be running throughout the year using the resource 'The New Testament You Never Knew'

This is a DVD based teaching resource with study guide and covers 8 topics, taken over 8 months – 26 Jan (at the hall), 16 Feb, 22 Mar, 26 Apr, 17 May, 28 Jun, 27 Sep, 25 Oct.

Topics include: - the Books of the New Testament (next Sunday evening); the World of Jesus; the Life and Death of Jesus; the Resurrection of Jesus; the Ministry of Paul; the Early Church; the Mission of the Church; and the Creation of the New Testament.



These have a 4 pronged benefit: - to gain knowledge, to experience life transformation, to grow in relationship with others and to apply what you learn to your life.

We will be planning for geographic based homes to host and where these groups are full, plan to introduce new venues. We will of course offer a group on every occasion at the hall. Please mark these Sundays in your diaries and we look forward to seeing you next Sunday evening at the hall for our first session together.
