Tuesday 19 November

For all in the medical profession including receptionists and ambulance staff. For all in positions of local leadership in our corps, in local churches and associated groups.



Titus 3: 1,2 and Hebrews 13: 13-17 and 1 Peter 2:13-17. While both Paul Peter

and the writer of Hebrews were aware of the imperfections.(to put it mildly) of Roman government they were united in calling on Christians to pray for all in authority knowing the importance of maintaining order for the general good and because Christian congregations needed a settled society in which to witness and worship. So do we.



Wednesday 20th November

Thank God for all who exercise the gift of one-to-one evangelism and those whose pastoral ministry relieves others of the burden of care or blight of loneliness. For those who give time to welcoming and talking with those who visit *The Light* and similar places. For those who try to give practical help in

the name and spirit of Jesus to the homeless, unfortunate and marginalised. For persons living alone, especially those confined to the house, and for those who visit them. For all who work in care homes. For the recently bereaved. For those anxious about family members or friends.



1 John 3: 14. John says that one proof that a person has been spiritually reborn is that they love the Christian fellowship - the brotherhood - and the individuals who compose it (with all their funny ways). In the light of the teaching of Jesus, and indeed the whole Bible, we may dare to add that our Christian love must include those outside our fellowship, expressing the love of Christ in practical ways: This is part of the Salvation Army tradition but to meaningfully maintain it calls for constant prayer.



Thursday 21st. November

For today, thank God for access to the printed word and to the natural environment. Pray for the teaching ministry at Bromley Temple and in other churches, both through regular

preaching and in the various Bible study groups that meet on weekdays. For all Christian writers, in weekly papers and magazines and in books, for Christian publishers and all who seek to share the written word. For all Christians in broadcasting. For all who try to raise awareness of environmental issues affecting the world God created .



2 Timothy 2: 1/2. It may be that in this age teaching must precede evangelism. In previous eras, evangelists could assume that many of their hearers, though uncommitted, had grounding in Christian beliefs. This is no longer so. The preacher must teach his hearers so that they will be equipped to teach the unchurched in the everyday. Also to show the relevance of the Christian message to contemporary issues affecting society, the environment etc. This is a tall order and prayer support is essential.



Friday 22nd November

For the immense privilege of regular worship and fellowship, praise, prayer and proclamation, thank God. Pray for God to guide and inspire all preparing

to preach on Sunday and/or to lead worship, or to testify or exercise musical ministry. And for receptive minds and greater faith that the Spirit of God may work even more effectively and the Christian Church may grow locally and nationally and throughout the world.



Acts 2: 42. Our Scripture verse tells of the four elements that made up the life of the original Christian community, following the coming of the Holy Spirit. The believers attended to the teaching of those whom Jesus had commissioned to proclaim and expound the gospel: they joined in mutual caring: they shared in table fellowship, and they prayed. Luke does not omit that last vital ingredient. We are blessed at Bromley in the teaching we receive and the many means of grace we regularly enjoy but we all share the privilege and responsibility to pray for the ministry of the Spirit in our meetings and for an openness to his leadings. Also that the power of God may be at work wherever the gospel is proclaimed and by whatever means throughout the world, the world for which God's Son was given that his Kingdom might come.
