40 Days with Jesus

Last Sunday we launched our **40 Days with Jesus** programme, and by the end of this Sunday will have distributed around 170 study books. A number of small groups have also formed and met together, so there is a growing sense of excitement and anticipation as we move into week two. It's not too late to join a group, or even start one. If you need help or guidance please talk to Ian Payne, or one of the corps officers. This week's study begins with the journey the two disciples took on their way to Emmaus, and our talk this morning gives a synopsis of the study notes contained in the book. When we use material and resources from the wider church, we sometimes come across elements of worship and service which we don't practice in the Army. This week's study makes minor reference to the Lord's Supper, and a later reference will be about baptism. For use in both personal study and small groups, I have printed off a report from the Army's International Spiritual Life Commission which gives us helpful guidance on these subjects (Handbook of Doctrine, pages 294-300).

Our prayer continues to be that **40 Days with Jesus** will strengthen our faith, deepen our love, and increase our hope. As we share together in this particular way, may we encounter Jesus powerfully through his Word and through the power of the Holy Spirit: 'And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.' (Matt. 28.20)
