An Invitation to Prayer ...

November 11th. 2018 marks the 100th. Anniversary of the ending of WW1.

SASRA (Soldiers' and Airmen's Scripture Reader Association) invites prayer for their work among the men of the armed services. They have designated the 100-day run-up to November 11th. (August 18th to November 11th) as a time of prayer.

You may have a link with the armed services or have an interest in them.

'The average age of the Army is 23, and these young people face a real risk of death or injury. They need a moral compass as they make life and death decisions under immense pressure. Many of them have had no meaningful exposure to the gospel before they join up.'

Scripture Readers are ex-servicemen usually of sergeant rank with a living experience of Christ. They wear a uniform (but without rank or privileges), and have free access within camps. They *'come alongside service personnel with a view to their spiritual welfare introducing them to a practical experience of the Christian faith as the basis of their character and morale.'*
