Safe Mission

Following a recent visit from our Regional Safe Mission Advisor we would like to draw your attention to a few matters:

- If you enter the building at a time that is 'out of the ordinary' for you to be there, could you please write your name on the **Whiteboard** and the time you entered the building. Upon leaving cross your name out. It is not easy to know who is in the building and should there be a fire we would need to know that everybody was out of the building. Similarly if you had an accident while in the building we may not know to look for you. It also means we do not try to set the security alarm when someone is in the building!
- The **door to the basement** where the boiler and extra cleaning products are located is to be kept locked. A broom and dustpan and brush for sweeping the floor can be found in the kitchen. If you need anything else from the basement, please see Iain, Alison or Gill.
- If you are **First Aid** trained and would be willing to offer assistance when a First Aider is required, could you let Major Alison know so that we can collate an up to date list of First Aiders.

General Data Protection Regulation

No doubt you will have heard about the new GDPR Regulation that was implemented in May of this year. This has implications about what personal details we can hold about corps members and how we store them. In the immediate, we need to make you aware that we cannot have lists of addresses and phone numbers in places where they can be accessed by the general public - so the Corps Directory can only be kept in the office, which is locked unless an authorised person is working in there. If you need to contact someone in an emergency, please ring Iain, Alison or myself – our phone numbers are on the notice board outside the office.

It is also not acceptable for addresses to be put on letters that are in the pigeonholes. If you are going to leave any correspondence for someone to collect from the foyer, please just put their name on it. Many thanks! Gill
