We will be looking at Mark 3: and the emotion Jesus showed toward the Pharisees. *'Which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill.'* One of the consistent themes that Jesus focusses on in his 3 year ministry found in the gospels is not to give emphasis to our actions i.e. how you appear to the world. Jesus' emphasis is of the heart, i.e. how you appear before God, in the area where no one else can see. And that is so important. No matter how well things appear on the outside, are you the same on the inside? What is going on in your soul, in the inner part of your life, is so much more important than any outward appearance of your life.

William Barclay said that we should *'read the bible in such a way that you will have an encounter with God!'* We'll be reading Psalm 103: 1-14 and as we meditate on the passage hopefully we will hear God's voice speaking clearly to us.
